On preparing to face the Royals...

The boss talks Reading...

"It's a quick turnaround for us going from Saturday to Tuesday. Yesterday the players rested and recovered and we have assessed the opposition.

On whether he'll shuffle the pack...

"That depends on the bodies we have available to us.

"Jordan Hugill is still not quite right, he's got a bit of a chesty cough and he's not physically quite where we want him to be.

"Grant Hall played his first 90 minutes for a few months at the weekend as well, so we'll have to assess where we are and make a decision.

"Obviously, I don't want to put anybody at risk, that goes without saying, but again, we have to make a decision because every game is so important." On Grant Hall...

"As I said, it was his first 90 minutes for some time and we did contemplate taking him off because we know what he's not had in terms of game time.

"We decided against it, because I felt that sometimes when you're in a defensive rhythm it is so difficult to come on as a substitute and get up to the speed of the game.

"Hally signalled to me that he was okay. It was probably a bit of a risk and we did look after him last week. Credit to him for playing 90 minutes, I didn't want to change the backline, they were where they needed to be for the game."

"I was pleased with Tom when he came on.
